

Missouri Lions Special License Plate

General Information:

The Missouri Lions Special License Plate is ready for production. A donation of \$25.00 for the use of the Lions emblem is required annually by the State of Missouri. The good news--- this money will stay with the Missouri Lions. One half will go to the Missouri State Lions and the other half will be returned to the District of the license plate applicant. (The State Lions Office, your District Governor or Club President have the application for this part of the paper work.)

The license plate shall not exceed six characters in length. If it is a handicap plate, one character will be lost due to the handicap emblem being used by the Lions emblem.

The plate will be made any month of the year. If you want to obtain the Lions plate before the renewal date, the Department of Revenue will pro-rate the plate.

In case you want to obtain the new biannually plate, the emblem use fee will be doubled (\$50.00). Please note that the two year plate will not be available before July 2000.

Any current Lions member may apply for the new Lions plate. As a Lion, you may select a personal or business name for the plate. Vehicles titled in a Company or Corporation can be authorized if the owner is a Lion.



Steps to Follow:

1. Fill out The Authorization and Handling Fee Statement first. Write a check for the \$25.00 fee, payable to the Missouri Lions, and send to the Missouri Lions State Office.

2. After you have the Authorization and Handling Fee Statement back from the Missouri Lions State Office, submit the statement and a \$15.00 personalized plate fee with your Application for Missouri Personalized and Special License Plates to:

3. When you apply for the special license plate at the Department of Revenue or your local authorized License Bureau Office, their current form does not show the Lions Club. Please check the space titled other and write in Lions Club.

5. After the Application for the special plate has been sent to the Missouri Department of Revenue, allow a couple of weeks to get your license.

Dr. Dwayne Garrett, Past International Director

Dr. Dwayne Garrett, of Wentzville, Missouri USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of the International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 79th International Convention, held in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, 1996. Past Director Garrett is a veterinarian.

A member of the Wentzville Lions Club since 1966, Past Director Garrett has held many offices within the association, including club president, zone chairman, vice district governor and district governor. In addition, he has served as his district's extension chairman, and as both vice chairman and chairman of the Council of Governors. He served nine years on the Wentzville R-IV Board of Education, two years as vice president and five years as president. He has served as elder, deacon and president of the congregation at his church. He received the first Chamber of Commerce Community Service Award, a service award from the Wentzville school district and was recognized as a 4-H Leader in veterinary science. Past Director Garrett currently serves on the board of directors of The Missouri Bank in Wentzville.

Past Director Garrett and his wife, Lion Jeanette, have one son, Lion Curt, daughter-in-law Sally and three grandsons.
