C. Wayne Henderson (11/10/1931 – 4/4/2000) – Lionism lost one



of its leaders last month when Past International Director (1992-94) Lion Wayne Henderson died following an apparent heart attack. A Lion since 1969 when he joined the Ferguson Lions Club, Lion Wayne held most of the key offices in lionism including District Governor from District 26-A2 in 1985-86. He has been honored with many awards in lionism including the International Leadership award, four International President's Awards, and the Ambassador of Good Will Award. He is also a Melvin Jones Fellow. More importantly Lion

Wayne has been a friend and is an outstanding example of our motto, We Serve. At the time of his death he was highly involved in many activities in Missouri Lionism. To say Lion Wayne will be missed is an understatement. His many friends within Missouri Lionism, from all states and provinces in the US and Canada, and from around the world will remember him and look to his example for guidance.

Eldon McNatt -- A member of the Aurora Lions Club and District Governor (1963-64) from District 26-E, Lion Eldon McNatt died April 25, 2000. Among his many offices and activities Lion McNatt was probably best known to the Lions of Missouri for his service to the Lions Business opportunities for Missouri Blind, Inc (LBOMB). He served this organization from its inception to his death, with the exception of the required breaks in service, as both a member and occasional officer. Many times he served as the President of the Board of Directors. Lion McNatt was consistently one of its most dedicated members



and as such will be remembered fondly by the Blind Vendors of Missouri, the Business Enterprise Program and the Lions of Missouri.

Fred Phillips (7/21/39 – 3/20/2000) – Lion Phillips joined lionism



in June of 1972 and served four clubs, the Fenton MO Lions Club, Pacific MO Lions Club, Concord Village MO Lions Club, and the Lake Havasu City Arizona Lions Club, the first two as president. Lion Fred represented the Pacific Lions Club and the Lions of District 26-A1 as District Governor for the year 1989-90 and the Lions of Missouri as Council Chairman the same year. As part of his responsibilities as Council Chairman he served on the Board of Directors of the Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation. Later for the period 1992-98 he again served on that board as a representative of District 26-A1

from the Concord Village Lions. Lion Phillips was a Melvin Jones Fellow. Lion Fred was well known to the Lions of District 26-A1 and Missouri as a Lion who lived up to the Lions motto "We Serve".

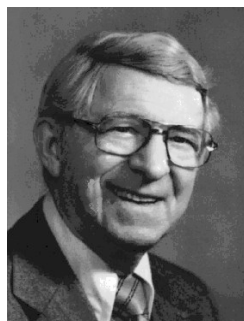
Sara Janes - a very active and well known business and civic leader in the Qulin area died September 14 1999 in Albuquerque New Mexico. She was born November 23, 1928 in Doniphan. At time of her death she was the Treasurer of the Qulin Lions Club. Her Club and her community will certainly miss this active and involved community member.

Vernon Myer – Served as District Governor and Council Chairman



(1988-89) from the Altenburg Lions Club in District 26-D. Lion Myer was the Council Chairman who put song back into the Council of Governors meetings and showed slides of some of his many trips including the International Convention in Australia. A friend to all Missouri Lions died April 24, 2000.

Dr. Joseph S. Shockey – Served as District Governor (1979-80)



from the Kansas City Alpha Lions Club, a member since 1948, in District 26-G. Lion Shockey was well known for his wit. He could quickly defuse any tense situation. An article about Doc appeared in the November Issue of this Newsletter. Doc died December 17, 1999. Lion Shockey and his jokes will long be remembered.

Horst Glimka – was a member of the O'Fallon Lions Club in District 26-A2. Members of Lion Horst's club and district as well as those who attended State and International Conventions knew Lion Glimka as an active, very dedicated, outspoken Lion who was not afraid to roll up his sleeves and get his hands dirty for lionism. Lion Horst Glimka died January 9, 2000 after a period of poor health. Lion Horst will certainly be missed.
